We work tirelessly to ensure all children reach their potential: every minute of the school day matters. It's important to us that every child makes good progress from their own starting points and aspires to do their very best.

While we believe that learning is about more than exams, our pupils make excellent progress and achieve good SATS results. We are proud of their commitment to learning and support them to make even greater

progress through small group teaching, booster classes and extension work for more able children. Our teaching is full of rigour and pace and is of a consistently high standard.

We ensure our Pupil Premium children are helped to make similar progress to their peers by using the Pupil Premium grant to raise standards and close the gap in attainment.

Early Years

Our younger children are at the heart of Dalmain's success. We know the love of learning begins at the start of our children's educational journeys.

Children in Early Years classes thrive in a stimulating learning environment. We use resources such as StorySacks, speaking and communications skills workshops, and high quality phonics and numeracy teaching to ensure our younger students make excellent progress.

We work hard to develop children's curiosity and critical thinking skills through independent play and adult-led experiences, so that they become lifelong learners who are excited about what the future holds for them

Music, Dance and Drama

Exposure to music, dance and drama benefits all areas of children's learning, so it is embedded deeply into our curriculum.

All children can learn a musical instrument from Key Stage 2 (lessons are free for Pupil Premium students), and we have a well-regarded choir, string ensemble and brass band.

Children in Years 5 and 6 are offered dance classes with teachers from Trinity Laban, and there are regular

opportunities for performance and involvement in drama workshops. Every class is named after a composer or musician, and pupils often get the chance to see and hear their class musician perform, or communicate with them digitally.

Nurturing and Growing

At Dalmain we want our children to feel safe and secure when they are at school, and to enjoy coming here, so every school adult takes responsibility for safeguarding the welfare of all children.

As well as a special needs coordinator, Dalmain employs a learning mentor to break down barriers to learning, ensuring all children are appropriately nurtured to reach their potential.

We ensure all children are fully aware of the dangers of the internet, and work with parents and carers to keep all of our children safe online.

The children's behaviour was judged Outstanding in the most recent Ofsted report, and we have a zero-tolerance policy on bullying.

Outdoor Learning

Learning outdoors helps our children progress, and we have a trained Forest School practitioner on our staff. In Forest School sessions children build dens and create environmental art, encouraging self-esteem, independence and teamwork.

Our outside areas include an allotment, a wildlife garden, a number of playgrounds and our award-winning multi-use games area. Children develop the skills of enquiry, experiment and reflection while using these areas.

Residential trips in Years 4 and 6 allow the children to learn outdoors and build bonds between classmates.

Parent and Carer Involvement

We encourage parents and carers to take an active part in their children's education at Dalmain, and many parents also choose to volunteer either at the school or through our active parent and carer association Friends of Dalmain (FoD).

The school is renowned for its excellent fairs and other fundraising events, which frequently feature creative experiences such as interactive drama installations, storytelling and circus skills.

The funds raised by FoD help to support the school's work, enhancing children's learning experiences, financing school trips and providing new resources to improve the learning environment.

Admissions

Our admissions are processed centrally by Lewisham Borough admissions team. If the school is oversubscribed places will be allocated to:

- 3. Siblings of children already in school
- 4. Children who live closest to the school
