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Writing

Complete your writing. You will be reading it aloud tomorrow! Also, complete any other work that you have started. You will need all your props (Jack in the box and your Pandora's Box) for your show. Ask your adults to help you to check that you have everything you need.



What's in the box?

I am sure you have not forgotten how to play our What's in the box? game. You can teach your adults what they need to do, but just in case you have forgotten, here is a reminder. Choose items that are interesting to place in your box (you can use your

Pandora's box). The aim of this game is to develop the following skills: turn taking, listening and communication. Your reward for doing all three, is, you get to choose a toy to play with!

Rules:

Do not touch the box or any of the objects until it is your turn. The leader shows each item, names it and places it in the box. Everyone sings the song. You will need to teach the song to your participants. You ask politely when it is your turn e.g. 'Can I have the...please.' Decide who will go first, second, third etc.

Ideally you should sit in a circle and place the box in the middle First, you maintain a steady beat by tapping on a flat surface, or if this is not possible you can clap your hands. When you are ready, you can begin!

You open the box after singing the song and the first person gets to choose one item. You sing the song again and repeat this until everyone has had a turn.
