- Have a morning meeting similar to our carpet time and discuss the plans for the day and include the weather, days of the week, how they might be feeling etc.
- Create a behaviour plan rewards and consequences, a sticker chart works well.
- Think about activities that can be undertaken on a larger scale outdoors
- Allow snack /water /toilet breaks
- Allow 10-15 minutes of physical activities in between sitting down
- Positively encourage mark making
- Praise their effort reward with stickers etc. (they need the boosting)
- Review your schedule and discuss what went well and what needs to be improved
- Be kind to yourself and give yourself a pat on the back
