Royalty in African countries have and are still present in Africa. Some countries have one governing monarchy like Morocco or Swaziland, but there are several hundred traditional monarchs dispersed across Africa in cities (urban), villages and towns (semi-urban and rural) communities in independent countries.

Ghana is one of those countries, with a very rich culture, and one tribe in particular having a long history of royalty.

Was the 4th ruler of the Asante people. He ruled from 1701-1717

(born 1680- died 1717).





The Dynasties

Chinese history is divided into dynasties – period whereby the country is ruled by one royal family.

Chinese Dynasties





Above is an illustration of **Wu Zetian**, the first and only female Emperor of Ancient China.

Wu Zetian (**Wu Tse-tien**) was the first female monarch of China. She ruled under the name of her self-proclaimed Zhou Dynasty, from 690 to 705. She had previously been

a member of the Tang Dynasty. Wu was a friend of Emperor Taizong. After his death, she married his successor and 9th son, Emperor Gaozong in 655. After Gaozong's died in 660, Wu Zetian ruled until 705. She is the only woman to have ruled China in her own right.

Choose an activity to complete

Red challenge

Create a poster for tourists coming to the UK inviting them to the royal event. You must write down the name of the event, e.g. "Meghan and Prince Harry's Royal Wedding". You must also tell us when and where the event is taking place and how much the tickets to this event will cost. You also need to decorate your poster.

Green challenge

Create a flyer for the tourists that have come to visit the UK. Your flyer must include:

- Start with an exclamation or question.

 E.g. What an amazing city! / Have you ever wondered what it's like to visit London?
- A brief description of London.
 What will the tourists see when they arrive?
- A description of the royal event that you have chosen.
 When and where is the event taking place?
 Why should the tourists come to the event?
 What will they see when they get there?
 Will it be a once in a lifetime opportunity to see the Royal Family in person?

Blue challenge



Create a travel brochure for tourists coming to the UK. For your brochure, you can create a mini booklet, with subheadings for each section such as: 'Royal Events', 'What to Wear', 'Famous

Royal Buildings' etc. In a travel brochure you are trying to persuade people to visit the country, so make sure you include the present tense and imperative verbs (bossy verbs).



This piece of music is from the 'Peer Gynt' suite which tells the story of the boy Peer Gynt who falls in love with a girl but is not allowed to marry her.

He runs away to the mountains but is captured by the trolls who take him to their King.

Peer tries to escape but is chased by the trolls and runs into the troll King but eventually gets away. Listen out for the strings that play the sound of Peer tiptoeing and running to escape.

The tiptoeing sound is made when the string players pluck the strings of their instruments which is called pizzicato using their fingers rather than the bow.

Can you creep around your room to the music pretending that you are Peer? You will hear when Peer comes across the troll King. You will need to run away then


