



Books to read...

A selection of recommended books from different genres that every Dalmain child should read by the end of Year 1!




He tries to keep his new friend a secret, but there's only so long you can keep a whale in the bath without your dad finding out.





Then Something turns up and wants to be friends. But Something Else isn't sure he's like him at all...







just doesn't fit in. And who's that shadowy figure who seems to be following him around?




humiliation of his desperately dowdy new look and rediscover the action hero within or will the burden of the knitted green monstrosity be too great?








George Kranky's Grandma is a miserable grouch. George really hates that horrid old witchy woman.
