| Attendance | <p>All children are expected in school every day – it is the law and it is compulsory from Monday 7th September. The Government have been very clear that they will issue fines for non-attendance.</p> <p>The only exception is for Reception and Nursery pupils who will follow a staggered start timetable for the first few weeks, after which they are also expected in school promptly every day.</p> |
| Punctuality | <p>With eight different year groups, we are very conscious that some parents/carers have children across a range of year groups and will need to drop off children at different points. We will keep this under careful review and will accept children arriving slightly later within reason to accommodate the time it takes to move from one drop off place to the next.</p> |
| Staggered Start & Pick Up Times | <p>In order to keep everyone safe, including the adults dropping off and picking up, we are going to start the term with staggered drop-off and pick-up times, limited to either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 8:45am drop off – 3:00pm pick up• 9:00am drop off – 3:15pm pick up <p>Please see accompanying Autumn 1 Timetable document for further details and drop off / pick up locations for each year group.</p> <p>Please can we ask that parents respect social distancing outside of the school gates for the safety of all within our community.</p> |

This documentation includes information about their start date and timings. If you need another copy of this, please contact the School Office at admin@dalmain.lewisham.sch.uk</p> <p>1:1 Meetings with Class Teachers</p> <p>We have arranged for 1:1 meetings with your child's class teacher, specific details of which have been emailed individually, and we are very much looking forward to getting to know you all during this meeting.</p> <p>Please enter the school via the Main School Gate (yellow), after which you will be directed to your meeting by a member of staff.</p> <p>We are offering time slots of 20 minutes for children who have not attended Dalmain's Nursery and 15 minute slots for children who did attend our Nursery. Please check the timetable carefully and arrive on time for the meeting. We will be operating to a very tight schedule and will not be able to accommodate additional time if you are running late. | Uniform | <p>From September, we will be expecting all children to be in full school uniform every day. The Government guidance now states that children’s clothes do not need to be washed more than normal but we would recommend sending your children in to school in clean clothes each day. Please avoid bringing any additional items of clothing to school.</p> <p>If any families need support with school uniform, please contact the School Office know as we have some spare uniform and lost property available.</p> <p>School uniform consists of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maroon sweatshirt or cardigan with school badge • Trousers / skirt / shorts – grey or black • Plain white shirt, or white polo shirt (with or without school badge) • Summer dresses – yellow & white or red & white check (can be worn in the Autumn Term if you wish) • Footwear: plain, flat, dark coloured shoes or dark coloured trainers (no heels or open toes) • Tie (optional) • No logos or designer labels are permitted |
| PE Kit | <p>On your child’s PE day, your child should come into school in PE kit and then wear it for the day. This means we will not have PE kits being stored in school and you can wash them each week. Your child will be told their day for PE on Monday 7th, there will be no PE on the first day.</p> <p>PE kit consists of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • White T-shirt (school badge optional) • Dark blue, grey or black shorts / jogging bottoms • Dark coloured plimsoles or trainers |

| Lunchtime | <p><i>What will happen at lunch time?</i></p> <p>Children will remain in their bubbles at lunch time. Playground areas will be cordoned off to ensure social distancing and lunch times will be staggered to ensure all children can access outside areas.</p> <p><i>What will happen with school dinners?</i></p> <p>We have been working closely with AiP (our meal providers) to make sure we provide a balanced and nutritious menu in a safe environment. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will receive hot meals in their classroom which will be provided in biodegradable boxes with biodegradable cutlery. Teachers will assist children to select their menu options each morning when the registers are taken.</p> |

| | <p>Key Stage 2 children will have a staggered lunch service in the main hall with a one-way system in place to ensure social distancing, with no more than one year group in the hall at any time.</p> <p>The three week menu is on our website: https://www.dalmain.lewisham.sch.uk/school-meals</p> <p>We strongly encourage children to have school meals this term. We are keen to avoid a large number of packed lunch items being brought into school and taken home again – any reduction of belongings that need to be brought into school makes the school environment safer for all children. If your child does need to bring in a packed lunch, please ensure that any waste is biodegradable (i.e. paper bags that can be put in the food waste).</p> <p>We will review this at October half-term.</p> <p><i>I've paid for school dinners last year.... what happens to the money in my ParentMail account?</i></p> <p>Any school meal payments will be carried over.</p> |
| Safeguarding | <p>Please follow the usual procedures for any safeguarding concerns or if you need support.</p> <p>A directory of support for safeguarding and wellbeing can be found on our website under Parent & Carers – Safeguarding & Wellbeing.</p> <p>If you have contacted Mrs Woodhall with non-urgent safeguarding concern, she will be responding upon our return to school on 7th September.</p> |
| Wellbeing | <p>Within our Recovery Curriculum, we have prioritised wellbeing of children at all levels. Dalmain is a Wellbeing Hub leader across Lewisham and the expertise we have within our staff team is exceptional. Miss Mann, one of our Assistant Headteachers, will be leading this and she will work closely with class teachers, the Inclusion Team and Senior Leadership to ensure that the needs of our pupils are met, particularly during this time of transition back to formal school learning.</p> |
| SEND | <p>All SEND needs will be met through quality first provision and the support dedicated to individual needs, as in a normal school year. We do not know if external agencies will come in to school as they would have but we will support them if they do and liaise promptly with these agencies and children's families where needed.</p> <p>With approximately 400 children returning to Dalmain in September after so long away, we expect there to be an increase in SEND needs and will focus our provision based on the priorities of individuals, our school resources and the personnel available. Please be assured that we have an exceptional team of experienced and dedicated practitioners who are skilled at supporting a wide range of needs in their classrooms to ensure that individuals make accelerated progress.</p> |
| Medical Needs including Medically Vulnerable | <p>Please bring all relevant medication back in to school as you would under normal circumstances. All medicines should be clearly labelled. Parents / carers need to deliver this to the School Office by Monday 7th September at the latest – no child who needs medication should be in school until this has been received by the School Office.</p> <p>The local authority and DfE wish for all children to return to school in September 2020. We know that some parents with children who are considered medically extremely vulnerable will be worried about returning to school. Where this is the case, please contact the school who will be able to advise parents/carers what to do.</p> <p>We will not provide distance learning while the school has been directed to open. In the event of a local lockdown, we will reinstate our home learning approach and will be working to develop this in more detail</p> |
| Bubbles | <p>Each year group will be a single bubble. We have staggered lunchtimes and playtimes with the playground being sectioned into different areas so that we can limit the amount of mixing between year groups.</p> <p>We are working hard at developing measures to separate classes within year-group bubbles as much as possible and will continue to monitor how we can improve this provision.</p> |
| Assemblies | <p>In line with Government guidance, we will not be running any assemblies, including singing assembly, during Autumn Term 1.</p> |

| Equipment in School | <p>Pupils should bring in their own water bottle for their individual use. These must be labelled and can be refilled during the day.</p> <p>Pupils should not bring any unnecessary equipment into school. We will be giving pupils their own equipment to use while they are at school and these will be dedicated for their personal use. Any equipment shared across a year group e.g. sports equipment will be fully disinfected before each class uses it.</p> |
| Walking Home Alone | <p>From September, Y6 & some Y5 pupils will be allowed to walk to school by themselves, if parents so choose, as long as we have been given written parental permission and this arrangement has been agreed by the school first. It will be the individual parent's responsibility to discuss with their child the importance of social distancing and the necessary precautions to take to keep themselves and others safe on their journeys to and from school.</p> |

| Clubs | <p>We will not be running any clubs in school for Autumn 1 but will keep this under review and reinstate them as soon as we can.</p> |
| Individual & Small Group Music Lessons | <p>We are still working on our plans for individual and small group music lessons from September. As with all decisions, these will only be made after careful consideration of the latest Government guidance and a thorough risk assessment taking into account our specific building and staffing circumstances.</p> <p>Our music teachers are very keen to resume lessons and are working with us to facilitate this safely, and we will communicate with you again in September with our final plans. Please note, however, that there may be a slight delay to the expected commencement of lessons while we finalise arrangements.</p> <p>Looking ahead, we have been reviewing our individual and small group music offer to ensure that it is the best that we can offer, and will communicate with you in the Autumn Term about any changes that we may make from January 2021.</p> |
| Trips | <p><i>Will the residential trip go ahead for Year 6?</i></p> <p>We have managed to postpone the Year 6 residential and this has been rescheduled to be 24-28 June 2021. This will depend on any local/national lockdown measures in place at the time.</p> <p><i>Will the residential trip go ahead for Year 5?</i></p> <p>Year 5 were unable to attend their Naturesbase camping residential last term, so this has been rescheduled to 7-11 June 2021. This will depend on any local/national lockdown measures in place at the time.</p> <p><i>Will the residential trip go ahead for Year 4?</i></p> <p>We have a Year 4 Naturesbase residential trip booked for 28 June-2 July (dependent on any local/national lockdown measures in place at the time). We will write to Year 4 separately about this.</p> <p><i>I've already paid for a school trip. What happens to that money?</i></p> |

| | <p>Any money paid for the June 2020 Naturesbase or the September 2020 PGL trip will be carried over to the new trips. In the event that the trip doesn't go ahead, you will be refunded everything you have paid except the deposit.</p> <p><i>I've paid for school trips via ParentMail. How do I get that money back?</i></p> <p>If any trips/school journeys have been cancelled your money will be refunded (not deposits) via the ParentMail account.</p> <p><i>Will you still run school trips for all the children?</i></p> <p>School trips are an important part of the curriculum at Dalmain and we will look at ways we can reintroduce school trips as soon as possible, but because we don't want to use public transport, trips will be very difficult in the short term. For the moment, we will be focusing all our efforts on getting back to as normal a routine as possible for the children.</p> |
| Swimming | <p>Because the swimming pools have been closed, we have not been able to organise swimming lessons for the Autumn term as in previous years. We will monitor the situation, and if the pool reopens and we feel it is safe to deliver swimming lessons we will write to parents/carers of children in the relevant year groups.</p> |

| Academic Recovery | <p>First of all, please don't worry. We are in a very challenging situation that we would never have wished for our children and the reality is there will have been a wide variety of learning experiences for all our children over the last few months.</p> <p>Our full Recovery Curriculum is ready for September and staff have received additional training to address the different starting points that children will return to us with. We will continue to provide an ambitious and broad curriculum in all subjects. We will focus on all elements of the national curriculum, with an emphasis on practising basic skills and addressing gaps in knowledge.</p> <p>Our provision will be focused on filling any educational gaps and to bringing all children up to the expected level of attainment. However, wellbeing will be the primary focus of our curriculum when the children return.</p> <p>Our Recovery Curriculum will last as long as needs to ensure that the children are happy, settled and back up to the expected attainment levels. The Government announced a large funding package to support this which we will be utilising in a variety of ways to close as many gaps as possible.</p> <p>In the event of a bubble having to isolate, or a partial or complete lockdown, we will revert back to home learning packs being posted on the home learning page of the website, class teacher calls, messages and printed packs for those on our list. We continue to look into different ways of providing remote education should this situation occur again and will keep our home learning strategy under review.</p> |
| Assessments | <p>No pupils will be tested more than any previous academic years and we will continue to follow our Assessment Policy as normal.</p> <p>Unfortunately, the Government has decided to proceed with the Year 2 & Year 6 SATs tests next Summer. This is not the decision that we had hoped for, and we will be supporting both the wellbeing and academic health of our pupils on their return in response. We will not be testing these pupils any more than any other year and will be extremely sensitive to their individual needs, paying particular attention to anxiety and mental wellbeing.</p> <p>We intend to provide a programme of additional support for our Year 6 pupils to ensure that they are "secondary ready" and we will write to you as soon as we have solidified these plans once we have the term underway.</p> |

| Transition | <p>We are exceptionally privileged to have such a skilled, dedicated and aspirational team of teaching staff at Dalmain, and we are extremely confident that all of our children will thrive under the tutelage of their 2020-21 teachers. We are also very excited about learning about an amazing range of animals next year too!</p> <p>Children were provided with books to read over the summer, a transition pack with the welcome letter from their new class teacher and their holiday homework packs, including a range of engaging activities to support children with their learning between the end of last term and September. Parents will also have received their child's end of year report with information about progress and areas for development as of March 2020. If you were unable to collect your child's report in July please email admin@dalmain.lewisham.sch.uk to arrange a suitable time to pick it up.</p> <p>We recognise just how extremely unsettling this period has been for pupils and that it was not possible to facilitate the normal transition activities. However, we have instead incorporated them into our Autumn 1 plans to ensure that pupils can adjust to being back in school quickly.</p> <p>These activities will vary from class to class and may last for different lengths of time depending on the individual needs of pupils. Additionally, all staff have received additional training to support pupils to settle into their new classes and will take appropriate action where needed so that children can feel confident to learn and excel.</p> <p>If your child is missing last year's teacher there will be times in the day when staff will be able to say "hello" on duty and will no doubt will take the opportunity to make contact with their previous pupils. This will happen in a safe and socially distanced way, of course.</p> |

| Risk Assessments | <p>All decisions are made after a thorough risk assessment process involving the Local Authority, School Governors, the Staff Team and Unions.</p> <p>We keep all risk assessments under constant review.</p> |
| Hygiene Measures to Prevent Transmission | <p>We will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • use the COVID-19: cleaning of non-healthcare settings guidance to inform our school-specific risk assessments • ensure that sufficient handwashing facilities are available; all classrooms have access to sinks, soap, paper towels; hand sanitiser will be available in areas without access to soap and water • clean surfaces that children and young people are touching, such as toys, desks, chairs, doors, sinks, toilets, light switches, more regularly than normal • have additional cleaners, responsible for cleaning touch points, who will work alongside the premises team throughout the day and follow a specific timetable • ensure that lidded pedal bins for tissues are emptied throughout the day • where possible, ensure spaces are well ventilated • prop doors open, where safe to do so (bearing in mind fire safety and safeguarding), to limit use of door handles and aid ventilation • follow our updated Covid Safe Agreement and speak regularly with children about the expectations within • adjust teacher movement in class to ensure that we fit within safety guidelines • strongly encourage children to walk / cycle to school wherever possible <p>All adults and children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • frequently wash their hands with soap and water for 20 seconds and dry them thoroughly with disposable hand towels |



| | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • clean their hands on arrival at school, before and after eating, and after sneezing or coughing • be encouraged not to touch their mouth, eyes and nose • use a tissue or elbow to cough or sneeze and use bins for tissue waste ('catch it, bin it, kill it') • ensure that help is available for children and young people who have trouble cleaning their hands independently • encourage young children to learn and practise these habits • move around school using the spacers that have been positioned around school to encourage distance between individuals |
| <p>PPE – Staff & Pupils</p> | <p>Public Health England does not recommend the use of face coverings in schools. Primary aged children are not required to wear masks while on public transport or in public places. When pupils arrive in their class they will be required to wash their hands immediately.</p> <p>If your child needs to wear a face-mask at school due to health reasons, you will be required to provide written confirmation from your child's doctor before your child will be allowed to wear a mask in school.</p> <p>We continue to have a stock of PPE within school, including face-masks, disposable gloves, disposable aprons, hand sanitisers and soap, if required for close first aid for example.</p> <p>We will follow the Government guidelines which state:</p> <p><i>The government is not recommending universal use of face coverings in all schools. Schools that teach children in years 7 and above and which are not under specific local restriction measures will have the discretion to require face coverings for pupils, staff and visitors in areas outside the classroom where social distancing cannot easily be maintained, such as corridors and communal areas and it has been deemed appropriate in those circumstances. Primary school children will not need to wear a face covering.</i></p> <p><i>In particular, schools that teach years 7 and above may decide to recommend the wearing of face coverings for pupils, staff or visitors in communal areas outside the classroom where the layout of the schools makes it difficult to maintain social distancing when staff and pupils are moving around the premises, for example, corridors.</i></p> <p>In primary schools where social distancing is not possible in areas outside of classrooms between members of staff or visitors, for example in staffrooms, headteachers will have the discretion to decide whether to ask staff or visitors to wear, or agree to them wearing face coverings in these circumstances.</p> <p>Based on current evidence and the measures that schools are already putting in place, such as the system of controls and consistent bubbles, face coverings will not be necessary in the classroom even where social distancing is not possible. Face coverings would have a negative impact on teaching and their use in the classroom should be avoided.</p> |
| <p>Child Showing Symptoms</p> | <p>We will follow the Government guidelines which state:</p> <p><i>If anyone becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature in an education or childcare setting, they must be sent home and advised to follow the COVID-19: guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection guidance.</i></p> <p><i>If a child is awaiting collection, they should be moved, if possible, to a room where they can be isolated behind a closed door, depending on the age of the child and with appropriate adult supervision if required. Ideally, a window should be opened for ventilation. If it is not possible to isolate them, move them to an area which is at least 2 metres away from other people.</i></p> <p><i>If they need to go to the bathroom while waiting to be collected, they should use a separate bathroom if possible. The bathroom should be cleaned and disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else. PPE should be worn by staff caring for the child while they await collection if a distance of 2 metres cannot be maintained (such as for a very young child or a child with complex needs). In an emergency, call 999 if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk. Do not visit the GP, pharmacy, urgent care centre or a hospital.</i></p> <p><i>If a member of staff has helped someone who was unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, they do not need to go home (although this will be offered to any member of staff if the</i></p> |

| | <p><i>case arises) unless they develop symptoms themselves (and in which case, a test is available) or the child subsequently tests positive (see 'Confirmed Case' below). They should wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after any contact with someone who is unwell. Cleaning the affected area with normal household disinfectant after someone with symptoms has left will reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people. See the COVID-19: cleaning of non-healthcare settings guidance.</i></p> |
| <p>Testing</p> | <p>The Government advice is:</p> <p><i>When settings open to the wider cohort of children and young people, all those children and young people eligible to attend, and members of their households, will have access to testing if they display symptoms of coronavirus. This will enable them to get back into childcare or education, and their parents or carers to get back to work, if the test proves to be negative. To access testing parents/carers will be able to use the 111 online coronavirus service if their child is 5 or over. Parents /carers will be able to call 111 if their child is aged under 5.</i></p> <p>Alternatively, follow this link: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-getting-tested</p> <p>Access to testing is available to everyone but will only be done either via the NHS or GOV.UK.</p> |
| <p>Confirmed Case in School – What We Will Do</p> | <p>If Dalmain was to experience an outbreak (2 or more confirmed cases of coronavirus among pupils or staff within 14 days, or if there is an increase in pupil or staff absence rates due to suspected cases of coronavirus), we will contact our local health protection team. This team will advise any additional action.</p> <p>Where an outbreak in a school is confirmed, a mobile testing unit may be dispatched to test others who may have been in contact with the person who has tested positive. Testing will focus on the person's class, then their year group, then the whole school, if necessary. If our local area sees a spike in infection rates that is resulting in localised community spread, we may be advised to implement further measures.</p> <p>The Government guidance states:</p> <p><i>When a child, young person or staff member develops symptoms compatible with coronavirus, they should be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 7 days. Their fellow household members should self-isolate for 14 days. All staff and students who are attending an education or childcare setting will have access to a test if they display symptoms of coronavirus, and are encouraged to get tested in this scenario.</i></p> <p><i>Where the child, young person or staff member tests negative, they can return to their setting and the fellow household members can end their self-isolation.</i></p> <p><i>Where the child, young person or staff member tests positive, the rest of their class or group within their childcare or education setting should be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 14 days. The other household members of that wider class or group do not need to self-isolate unless the child, young person or staff member they live with in that group subsequently develops symptoms.</i></p> <p><i>As part of the national test and trace programme, if other cases are detected within the cohort or in the wider setting, Public Health England's local health protection teams will conduct a rapid investigation and will advise schools and other settings on the most appropriate action to take. In some cases a larger number of other children, young people may be asked to self-isolate at home as a precautionary measure – perhaps the whole class, site or year group. Where settings are observing guidance on infection prevention and control, which will reduce risk of transmission, closure of the whole setting will not generally be necessary.</i></p> |
| <p>Daily Temperature Checks</p> | <p>In light of Government advice, we will no longer be undertaking thermometer testing upon arrival, so children can head straight in to their allocated entrances. However, we may use a non-invasive thermometer which points to the forehead if we suspect a child of having symptoms.</p> |

| Parents On Site | <p>To reduce contact between individuals, maintain the safety of pupils and staff, we will not be allowing parents on to the school site unless specified in the Autumn 1 Timetable document. However, we will keep this position under review.</p> <p>We do appreciate that this will feel strange and may feel like contact with teachers is more limited but we must ensure that we are doing everything that we can to maintain as much distance as possible. Senior Leaders may be available every morning and evening, depending on their commitments across the school, and you can also make contact through the School Office at admin@dalmain.lewisham.sch.uk or complete the meeting request form on the school website as normal.</p> <p>We plan to run Parent Teacher meetings during Autumn Term 1 with the appropriate social distancing measures in place. A separate letter will be sent out to you with further details.</p> <p>You may only come in to the school building to drop off medication or for a pre-arranged meeting. All meetings must be confirmed prior to arrival and we will ask that you follow our Covid-Safe Agreement and social distancing measures while in school.</p> <p>As we continue to find our way through this situation together, we appreciate your feedback or suggestions about how we could improve contact with parents / carers while prioritising safety, and the education and wellbeing of our pupils.</p> |
| Cashless Payment & ParentMail | <p>From 1st September 2020, Dalmain will no longer accept cash payments. We ask that payments are made via ParentMail, but we do also have the facility to accept credit/debit card payments in the school office. You can also pay via PayPoint at selected shops.</p> |
