Minutes from 2022-2023

Going back over action points from last AGM with updates:

Treasurer's report:

Miriam Walden updated on the FOD finances. Full details can be found in the attached Financial Report. Initially Miriam outlined the incomings and outgoings over the previous year, stating the bank balance of £21,019 as of 1 September 2022 with a few outstanding transactions. The actual balance carried forward was £21,274. We closed the year with a similar bank balance of £20,783, as of 31 August 2023. This balance included 2x £40 in cash floats and PayPal donations worth £507.98 that hit our account in mid-September. FOD made a pledge to pay for a new climbing frame, the cost of which is £11,440. This will bring our carried forward balance to £9,343.05

- Incomings during the year included: Christmas takings (including the fair, trees, tea towels and Christmas cards) of £11,191, Summer fair taking of £8,146, Music night £2,095, Quizz night £1,039 and various school sales, sponsorship and donations.
- **Outgoings** included: Playground furniture £13,530. Pledge for the new climbing frame, £11,440. Pond in the wildlife garden £3,251. Expense for the summer and winter fair £6,334. Reading sheds, school disco, school entertainments, and quiz and music night expenses.

Headteacher's report

Big thank you to everyone who gets involved to support FoD and the school

Opal play:

Ongoing, the goal is teaching the kids about risk. The tires are stage one, more to come. The school is trying to get as much of the kids' time outside as possible

Playground updates

Trying to find a way to bring trees into the playground but it's a struggle, as there is so much pipework etc under the tarmac. Aiming to make the space greener if it's only with fake grass. There needs to be a 5m circumference around the trees.

Heat

The rear side of the building gets very hot, if they can plant trees that will help, also aiming for a new structure at the back of the year 1 classrooms.

Philosophy

Has been funded by the school, but they might need to cut it, unless FoD could fund it. Would be £1500 over the year. It's one lesson a week, specialists come in.

Trinity Laban

Costs £10,000, and is another thing that is possibly at risk as the budget is so tight. It's part of creative dance, the kids work towards a performance at Catford Broadway. It's not a club, everyone gets to do it. The boys do it too. Everyone does it together.

Budget

Generally pinched, pupil numbers are going down as people are moving out of London. School has less support staff but more specialists such as art. They don't make any money from clubs or lessons, theyre all just run to cover costs.

Eco-FoD

Run by Natacha Bisarre and Tonka

Mission is upgrading the nature area, and the planters round the school

7th or 8th of October open weeding day

- Need a list of who is coming
- Each parent needs to fill out a form saying while they're on school premises they are responsible for their own children
- Projects will be the raised balcony area, which has new steps and some new benches but is choked with a lot of weeds and mess, and the raised beds in the nursery.

Other suggestions

- 1. Regular meetings/socials
- 2. Rebecca: Suggested renting out the space for a workshop company like Box Build to run a session. Suggested taking bookings but not money in case you had to cancel. Miss Eisele explained it's difficult with toilets and insurance. Putting toilets in the pen would cost approximately £20,000. Getting portaloos is possible but also comes with a maintenance cost. The idea would have to be a big moneymaker to be worth it.
- 3. Shani: Music night worked really well. Hayley agreed the music night was great fun and it would be lovely to do it again.
- 4. Hayley and Zori: Nursery has air conditioning, what are we doing about the heat in the rest of the school? Miss Eisele explained that things like aircon and toilets should come under repairs and maintenance but the government is not keeping up their side of the bargain. There a legal minimum limit but no legal maximum for the building. Zori asking about separate units like American ones that go in the window.
